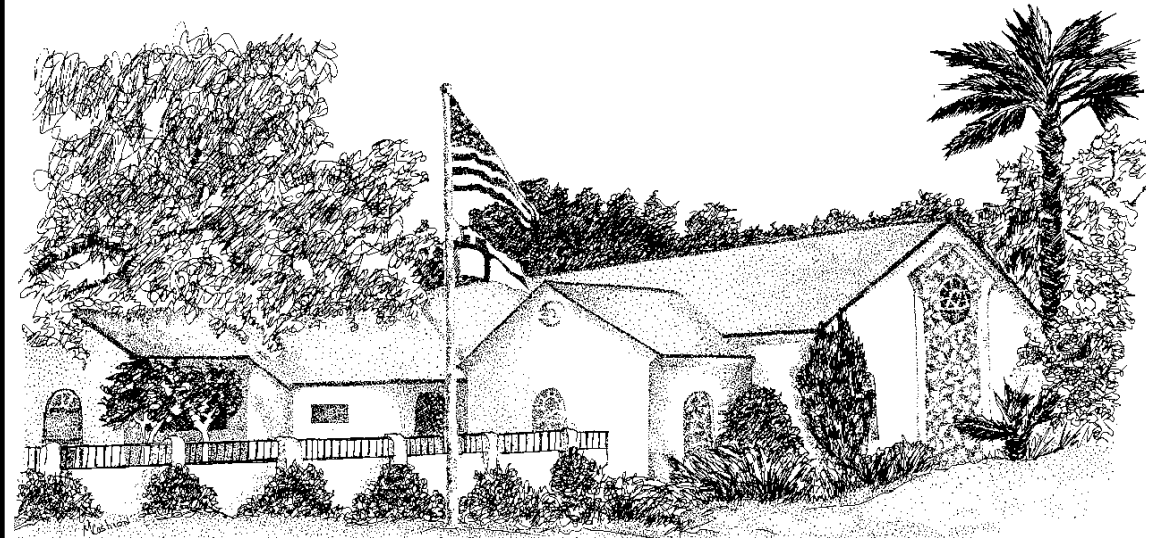

## First Sunday after Epiphany

### Proverbs 8:22-35

The LORD possessed me in the beginning of his way, before his works of old. I was set up from everlasting, from the beginning, or ever the earth was. When there were no depths, I was brought forth; when there were no fountains abounding with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills was I brought forth: While as yet he had not made the earth, nor the fields, nor the highest part of the dust of the world. When he prepared the heavens, I was there: when he set a compass upon the face of the depth: When he established the clouds above: when he strengthened the fountains of the deep: When he gave to the sea his decree, that the waters should not pass his commandment: when he appointed the foundations of the earth: Then I was by him, as one brought up with him: and I was daily his delight, rejoicing always before him; Rejoicing in the habitable part of his earth; and my delights were with the sons of men. **"EPIPHANY"** is a Greek word, meaning 'a manifestation; an appearance; a forthcoming.' The full title of the feast, as it appears in the Book of Common Prayer, is 'The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles,' i.e., to the (non-Jewish) nations. The observance of Epiphany is older, liturgically speaking, than the keeping of Christmas, and arose in the ancient metropolitan sees of the Christian East. The Feast itself is usually associated with the visit of the Magi (recorded in St. Matthew's Gospel), but the Sundays following treat the theme of Christ's glory made manifest at various striking moments in His early life and ministry—the finding of the youthful Jesus by his parents in the Temple after Passover, the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove at His Baptism, and His miraculous transformation of water into wine at the marriage-feast of Cana in Galilee, with which St. John tells us was the first of those signs by which he "manifested forth His glory."

**HOUSE BLESSING** It is an old custom, just as the Magi blessed the house of the holy family with their worship and offerings, for the clergy of the church to offer blessings on Christian homes during the season of the Epiphany. If you would like your house blessed this year, please contact Fr. Ralph or Fr. Peter to schedule. As part of this blessing, priests will often "chalk the door" of the dwelling, an outward expression of our hope and expectation that the Holy Spirit will guard and guide our out-going and our in-coming for the year. This is often performed with the acronym "C+M+B," which both stands for the Latin phrase, *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* ('May Christ bless this house'), as well

as for the names traditionally assigned to the Magi in medieval legend (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).
